TASKS, RESPONSIBILITIES, AND ADDITIONAL DUTIES

The Domestic Abuse Victim Advocate (DAVA) program provides Air Force personnel, their family members, or intimate partners who are victims of domestic abuse (DA) non-clinical emergent and urgent service whenever requested. The DAVA is co-located with the Family Advocacy office and is supervised by the Family Advocacy Officer (FAO).

- Partner with members of an interdisciplinary team to establish safety plans based on initial and ongoing risk assessments.
- Support the Family Advocacy Outreach Program and New Parent Support Program prevention activities to promote education about the prevention of DA.
- Activities may include outreach programs designed to increase awareness, educational briefings, skill-building classes, and the development of marketing tools and strategies.

REQUIREMENTS

- Bachelor's degree from an accredited university in any of the following disciplines: Social Work; Psychology; Marriage, Family, and Child Counseling; Counseling or Behavioral Science; Criminal Justice, or related field.
- Two years of experience assisting and providing advocacy services to victims of DA or sexual assault. (Required)
- Understanding of the military culture and/or experience working with military population (Preferred)
- Before starting work, must provide proof of immunization from the following diseases according to CDC guidelines: Hepatitis B, measles, mumps, rubella, varicella, and influenza, and proof of a negative TB skin test (completed within the past 12 months (if positive, proof of negative chest X-ray within the past 12 months).
